THE SHERIFF SAYS by Deputy Sheriff Marc Lombardi

Winter is here, so I would like to advise Grant city residents on some of the do's and don'ts of snowmobile and

ATV use in the City of Grant.

It is acceptable to ride either your snowmobile or ATV on the outermost portion of a ditch of any designated county road in Washington County, unless otherwise posted. Snowmobile or AVT users may ride against traffic flow in the ditch during the daytime, but MUST ride in the same direction as motor vehicle traffic during the nighttime. ATV use in county ditches is permissible from August 1st through April 1st.

It is acceptable to ride either your snowmobile or ATV on any local street within Grant City limits. Snowmobile or ATV uses must obey the same traffic laws as motor vehicles while traveling on local streets.

It is illegal for snowmobile or ATV users to drive on private property, unless the user has verbal or written permission from the property owner. It is illegal to ride any motorized vehicle on any portion of the Gateway Trail. It is illegal to ride on any school district or any other property owned by the City of Grant, unless City officials have granted you permission.

It is unlawful to operate a snowmobile with metal traction devices, including, but not limited to carbide studs, on any paved Washington County trail or any paved or unpaved portion of the Washington County Regional Railroad Authority Corridor (Hardwood Creek Trail.)

While traveling on lakes in the City of Grant, Snowmobile or ATV users must ride at least 100 feet away from any fish house.

It is illegal to ride an OHM (off highway motorcycle) on any public roadway anywhere in Washington County. OHM use is only acceptable on private property with verbal or written permission from the property owner.

Most cities and townships in Washington County have their own ordinances for snowmobile or ATV use. If you would like more information about where you can ride in Washington County, feel free to speak with one of our Water, Parks and Trails Deputies at (651) 430-7857.

Just remember, be careful and don't drink and ride.

CITY COUNCIL ACTIONS by Rick Vanzwol

September 2002

- Adopted the preliminary budget for 2003 and certified the preliminary tax levy number.
- Approved the Scott Olson variance request for a garage location closer to the road than the residence.
- Adopted MNDOT recommendation to reduce the speed limit on Kimbro Avenue to 45 MPH.
- Placed a moratorium on all development until January 8, 2003.
- Accepted the Auditor's report for the year 2001.

October 2002

- Approved the Roy Olson minor subdivision (lot line rearrangement).
- Agreed to plow snow on Hillcrest Court in Meadowlark Preserve.
- Removed the moratorium on all development and placed a moratorium on all adult entertainment businesses for six months.

November 2002

- Approved a resolution certifying the November 5 election results.
- Issued a certificate of compliance to Scott Warren for an accessory building closer to the road than the residence.
- Approved spending up to \$2,000 to repair an erosion problem in Orchard Hills.
- Extended a moratorium on permitting Seasonal Business in A-2 zones until July 2003.
- Agreed to hear a proposal from the Eckberg law firm regarding representation by that firm as the City Attorney.

December 2002

- Approved the MaeDelle Peterson minor subdivision request.
- Reappointed David Sherlock and Elizabeth Mursko to three year Planning Commission Terms.
- Appointed Nancy Havlish and Joyce Welander to three year Planning Commission Terms.
- Agreed to consider modifying the lease terms of the Tristar Communications Tower on the City Hall property.
- Appointed the Eckberg Law Firm as the Grant City Attorney beginning January 2, 2003.
- Agreed to proceed with a Purchase Agreement and Contract for Deed for the Waste Management property (formerly Bellaire Sanitation).
- Conducted the Truth in Taxation meeting on December 10, 2002.

January 2003

- Heard a report on a methamphetamine lab on the premises of a residence on 110th Street. Agreed to do further investigation about potential ongoing hazards to the community.
- Approved appointments for Council Members and others. Approved formation of a Finance Committee and a Roads Committee.
- Appointed Kevin Shoeberg to represent the City in the Waste Management issue, the Fritz agreement, and prosecutions.
- Approved a variance request for the Stinski property.
- Passed a replacement Planning Commission Ordinance 2003-96.
- Accepted Barb Ramsden's resignation from the Planning Commission and Appointed Howard Gochberg to fill the 2 year remainder of this term.
- Agreed to do snow plowing on 118th Street east of Kimbro Avenue.

- Passed Resolution 2003-1 enabling video taping and cable casting of City Council and Planning Commission meetings as soon as the equipment is provided by the Ramsey/Washington Cable Commission.
- Appointed Kevin Shoeberg as the City Attorney.
- Recinded the December motion to appoint Havlish and Welander to the Planning Commission.
- Adopted a new Planning Commission ordinance requiring a public application process for new Planning Commissioners.

HISTORY REPORT

In the 1917 Plat Book owned by Pat Kendrick DeMars, Grant's western border is located in the middle of White Bear Lake. An important landmark was the Duluth Junction. We would love to share your bit of history too.

The Historic Preservation Committee met on January 27, 2003. They continue to gather information on the historic schools that were located in Grant. Information from the Washington County Historical Society has been obtained. The earliest school discovered was from 1855 District 10 at 110th and Lansing. It was called the Greeder School. Any information about any of the schools, or copies of pictures that you can add to this would be appreciated.

The committee continues to work on identifying historic sites within Grant.

Howard Gochberg is looking at the long-term historic status of the Grant Town Hall. This includes determining the correct maintenance, possible renovations and necessary legal status of this committee.

Maroney's Sanitation Inc, both a Grant city business and Grant's recyclers have the following requests to help keep our roadways clean and 'stuff' out of our landfills. All items need to be contained, whether in paper sacks/ bags, or recycling bins.

Glass recycling: remove lids, rinse glass clean, and separate into three color categories: clear, green, and brown/ blue/amber.

Aluminum and Bi-metal cans including foil: rinse, and flatten if possible.

Magazines, Mixed Mail, phone books, and boxboard should all be bagged to prevent blowing. Wax bags from inside those cereal/snack boxes must be removed.

Newsprint must be bagged in paper bags - don't let it blow around, and don't put it in plastic bags.

Plastics must be narrow necked (#'s 1,2,3,4 or 5) rinsed, flattened, and contained so they don't blow around.

Pick-ups will continue to be the 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month. If Thursday is a holiday, the following day, Friday recycling will be picked up. That makes the schedule for the year:

February 13, 27 March 13, 27 April 10, 24 May 8, 22 June 12, 26 July 10,24 August 14, 28 September 11, 25 October 9, 23 November 13, 28 December 11, 26

Please have your recycling out by 7 am... and remember if it goes out the night before come spring, make sure critters don't get into it and scatter it. New residents can pick up a recycling bin from Art or Joyce Welander: 439-2598.

For those who have not participated - all you need is a good pair of gloves, plastic trash bags, and sturdy footgear. Roadside trash (and treasures) are brought to the Grant City Hall on Kimbro between nine and noon, where Maroney's Sanitation will handle disposal. It's a good way to enjoy that fresh country air and meet fellow Grant neighbors.

For a fee, Grant residents may drop off their own appliances for recycling at the town hall. Proof of residency (driver's license) and payment are required on that day. The fees are:

Refrigerator or Freezer: \$30 Stove: \$25 Dishwasher, Washing Machine, Dryer, Hot Water Heater or De-Humidifier: \$20

Maroney's Sanitation will deliver these appliances to A-Plus Appliance in St. Paul for removal of hazardous waste and recycling.
